## Success Rehabilitation Admissions Criteria

The following admission criteria must be met for all programs:

- Have an acquired or traumatic brain injury or other neurological impairment.
- Be 18 years or older.
- Have the ability to bear one's weight in standing position and complete a standing pivot to assist with transfers, with no more than 1 staff assistance to do so.
- Be medically stable, i.e., no functioning tracheotomies, no feeding tubes, no I.V.'s., no full-time oxygen. For persons served attending the Structured Day Treatment Program only, we will accept catheters and feeding tubes that will require no intervention/care during day program hours.
- Demonstrate the ability to control one's own actions with no history of excessive or long-standing physical violence, both within the legal system and in the community settings.
- Have funding for care.
- Be able to demonstrate a potential for progression and/or maintenance of skills within the structure of a rehabilitation program.
- Be able to demonstrate a willingness to participate in rehabilitation program.
- Be able to demonstrate the ability to maintain bowel and bladder control with little or no incontinence. Use of protective undergarments is acceptable.
- Be clear of all alcohol or illicit substances for at least thirty (30) days prior to being considered for admission and prior to admission for any program option. For persons served attending the Outpatient Structured Day Treatment Program only, one may be using with an approved Medical Marijuana card but cannot bring any marijuana products with them to any of the program locations.

The following additional criteria must be met for admission to <u>Off-Site</u> Home and Community programs (residential placement):

- Perform ADLS and IADLS with minimal assistance or with enhanced staffing support as necessary.
- Be able to share in completion of household chores such as cleaning one's own room and apartment/home, with assistance/support/guidance from staff as needed
- Can assist with meal planning, shopping, and cooking as able/with support and guidance from staff
- Be free of mental health/behavioral issues that would be inappropriate and/or unsafe in a community setting such as elopement, history of self-harm and/or recent history of ongoing substance abuse

The following additional criteria must be met for admission to <u>On-Site</u> Home and Community programs (residential placement):

- Perform ADLS and IADLS with minimal assistance or with enhanced staffing support as necessary.
- Be able to share in completion of private bedroom chores such as cleaning one's own room, with assistance/support/guidance from staff as needed
- Be free of mental health/behavioral issues that would be inappropriate and/or unsafe in a community setting such as elopement, history of self-harm and/or recent history of ongoing substance abuse

The following additional criteria must be met for admission to the <u>Outpatient Program</u>:

- Have transportation to/from identified Outpatient Program location.
- Agree to provide a prescription for any medications which will need to be taken while at the Outpatient Program.
